



6 FISHING AT VANGHAT For a little gentlemanly summertime sport, bring out that fishing rod, grab a can of beer and set out for some mahseer fishing on the banks of the Ramganga near Corbett. The Vanghat River Lodge has a private, secluded 10km fishing beat on the river (left), which is teeming with golden mahseer and *goonch* (catfish). There is plenty of other wildlife too—from curious otters that come to check you out to the odd sambhar passing by. The lodge, located on the banks of the river, consists of five airy stone-and-thatch cottages, each of which looks out across the river. If you don't have fishing gear, they'll provide you with it and even a gillie to help reel your catch in! And if you don't feel like fishing you can just lounge on the banks of the river. The camp is open through the year, but fishing is not allowed during spawning season—from June 15 to September 30.
